Fellowship in Liver Transplant Anaesthesia

- 1) Duration of the Fellowship: 1 year
- 2) Number of Fellowship positions per year: 1
- 3) Month of Initiation: March
- 4) Eligibility & Selection criteria for the fellowship:
 - i) Eligibility: MD/DNB (Anaesthesia)
 - ii) Selection Criteria: Fellowship will be advertised in newspapers, social media and hospital/department website. CVs will be called and reviewed. Interviews will be conducted in person or online after shortlisting. Selected candidates will be asked to join at the informed time.
- 5) Stipend of the fellows: 1.10 lacs/month (Approx.)
- 6) Scope of the fellowship: Aim of this fellowship is to provide knowledge and expertise in Liver transplant Anaesthesia to fellows as outlined below:
 - a) Clinical Skill Development/Curriculum of the Fellowship: During tenure of fellowship, fellows will be asked to participate actively in the management of liver transplant patients as follows:
 - i) Actively participate in the Liver transplant OPD to evaluate Liver Transplant recipients and donors preoperatively for eligibility, fitness and optimisation.
 - ii) Management of deceased organ donors
 - iii) Management of living donors for Liver transplant
 - iv) Exposure to living donor Liver transplant surgery (Adult/Paediatric).
 - v) Involvement in the management of Complex HPB Surgeries which the department of Liver Transplant & HPB Surgery undertakes.
 - vi) Postoperative monitoring and care of Liver transplant recipient and donors in ICU and ward.
 - b) Academics of the Department: Fellows will have to present/attend weekly academic sessions at hospital levels which includes Journal Club, Topic reviews and multi-disciplinary team meetings attended by Surgery, Critical Care and Hepatology teams.
 - c) Research in the Department: Fellows will be a part of ongoing research projects in the department.

- 7) Research Expectation from fellow:
 - i) One conference presentation (National/International)
 - ii) One publication in indexed journal
- 8) Log Book: Fellow will have to maintain a log book of work done during their tenure.
- 9) Exit Exam:

There will be an exit exam at the end of the fellowship. It will include written examination and viva voice, conducted at our hospital. There will be an external examiner to assess them.

- 10) Certification: At the end of the fellowship, fellows will be given an institutional fellowship certificate including a work experience certificate.
- 11) Accreditation/Recognition of Fellowship: At present this fellowship is not recognised by any body, but we will apply for recognition from LTSI/MUHS.
